


Purpose

The Boulder County Transportation Master Plan (TMP) describes Boulder County's current and planned multimodal transportation system and examines how to best meet future travel needs. The TMP combines past plans and new ideas into a single document to identify transportation facilities, services, and programs and develop recommendations for them.


The TMP helps implement the goals of the Boulder County Comprehensive Plan (BCCP):

- Ensure Effective and Efficient Management of the Existing Transportation System
- Minimize Environmental Impacts
- · Ensure Safety for All Modes
- · Support a Healthy and Sustainable Economy
- · Ensure Equitable Access to the Transportation System
- · Enhance County Identity and Community Character

The BCCP Transportation Element establishes objectives and policy direction to guide the development and maintenance of Boulder County's multimodal transportation system.


Households & Employment- in 2035




















South Westminster




